

CALL FOR PAPERS TO THE

PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLLOQUIUM BALTICUM

We have had the pleasure to listen to a great number of interesting papers at the meetings of the Colloquium Balticum, and it has often been said that a joint publication is a desideratum to make these contributions wider known in the *res publica litterarum* and to put our network, the Colloquium Balticum, on the scholarly map. The plans for a conference volume have now matured, and we are happy to report that Georg Olms Verlag has proved itself positive to publish our volumes.

The papers read at our meetings can roughly be divided into two main groups, those on Greek and Roman antiquity and those on the reception of the antiquity (in a broad sense) in the Baltic region. **The first volume will be devoted to the reception of antiquity in the Baltic region.**

We are thus happy **to invite you to submit articles for publication** in the first conference volume, the main themes of which will be:

- I Neo-Latin literature (poetry, prose, incl. dissertations)
- II Casualia (Greek and Latin occasional poetry or prose)
- III Translation studies
- IV The classical tradition
- V The history of classical scholarship
- VI The emancipatory function of the Classics

It is *not* required that the papers have actually been read at the Colloquium Balticum, but the papers have to treat subjects that conform with the main themes as listed above.

The papers will be peer-reviewed. The acceptance of the abstract is no guarantee that the paper will be accepted for publication.

Deadlines:

Submission of abstracts	Not later than February 4th
Submission of papers	Not later than August 15th
Release party in Marburg	November 7th

Please note that the schedule is tight, and early submissions both of abstracts and papers are most welcome.

Length of articles: 20, 000–40, 000 characters (incl. spaces).

Languages: English or German. Please note that papers written by non-native speakers have to be revised linguistically by native speakers. The author is responsible for this.

Illustrations are most welcome. Please indicate in the abstract what pictures are desired.

A guide for contributors is being prepared.
