

Is Modern Greek Historical Dialectology Possible?

I. Problems of MG dialectology:

1. reliable set of isoglosses is still to be worked out
2. connection between AG and MG dialects is underestimated
3. there is no historical dialectology

II. My goal is to show that historical Greek dialectology is possible

III. Data

1. literary texts (the Chronicle of Morea): ὀλπίζω (*Chr.Mor.2*, 25) vs. ἔλπιζω, ἔνι (*Chr.Mor.* passim), ἐλάλει (*Chr.Mor.273*), ἡμπορεῖ (*Chr.Mor.8182*), κόντος (*Chr.Mor.8046*) vs. κουντέσσα (*Chr.Mor.8045*)
2. [Manolessou 2010]: the analysis of different Byzantine and Early Modern Greek texts will enable to create maps of Greek dialectal phonological and morphological peculiarities
3. purchase agreements

IV. Documents from the Mount Athos. General features

1. dative: τῷ ἐν τῷ Ἀγίῳ Ὄρει κειμένῳ (A 086)
2. mistakes: ἦμε = είμαι, ἀπέμηνε = απέμεινε, θιγαταῖρα = θυγατέρα (A 270), πάγο = πάγω, πολεμίσο = πολεμήσω, ἐγό = ἐγώ, ἥτη = είτι (A 274), χορίς = χωρίς, πος = πως, ις = εἰς, στύλετε = στείλετε (A 276)
3. variation: ἥμπορή (A 086) and ὑμπορῶ ‘mogy’ (A 253), θελα and θελα (A 274)
4. hypercorrection: θιγαταῖρα = θυγατέρα (A 270)
5. archaization: φέγοντας (A 270) vs. φεύγοντας

V. Dialectal features. Phonetics

1. vowels: γυνό < γυμνό (A 083–084), τοῦ γέρω (A 252) = γέρον, τοῦ Τζάνο (A 270) = Ιωάννον, πομήναν (A 274) < απέμειναν
2. consonants: Γληγώρης vs. Γρηγώρης (A 086), τοῦ Τζάνου (A 086)/τοῦ Τζάνο (A 270) < Ιωάννου, τοῦ Δημητριτζάνου (A 270) < Δημητριωάννου, έτζι (A 083–084, A 270, A 274) < έτσι, Άλονίτζη (A 270) < Άλονίτση, ἄλος (A 086), ἄλοῦ, ἄλο (A 276) < ἄλλος, γράμα (A 276) < γράμμα, τοῦ Τζάνου (A 086), τοῦ Τζάνο (A 270) < Ιωάννου, τοῦ Δημητριτζάνου (A 270) < Δημητριωάννου, θέλλουν (A 083–084) < θέλουν, [ἴθελα] ἔχει < ἔχειν; [ίθελα] πάγη < πάγειν (A 274)

VI. Dialectal features. Phonetics?

1. ἔναι (A 083–084) vs. είναι, [νὰ] ḥv < [να] είναι (A 270), ίξεύρεται, ḥξεύρο (A 276), [νὰ μὴν] ἥμπορή (A 086), IND.PRS.1SG: ἥμπορῶ (A 253), ἐγκείνη (A 252) < εκείνη

2. mysteries: ἔκονόμος (A 270) vs. οικονόμος, πελι πολεμίσο (A 276) = θέλει πολεμήσω?

VII. Morphology

1. imperfectum: εύρισκετον (A 083–084), ἥτον (A 270), ἡξεύρο (A 276)
2. augment: ἐκάμανστα (A 253), ἤγόρασεν (A 083–084), ἤγόρασα (A 274)
3. no augment\stress movement: πομήναν (A 274) < απέμειναν

VIII. Vocabulary: καμπά (A 086) < it. Campo

Conclusion: documents from the Mount Athos may provide very important evidence, so they should be thoroughly analyzed

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
