




BALANCE

We almost never reflect on the nature and meaning of balance, and yet without it our physical reality would be utterly chaotic [...]. The structure of balance is one of the key threads that holds our physical experience together as a relatively coherent and meaningful whole. [...] The meaning of balance begins to emerge through our acts of balancing and through our experience of systemic processes and states within our bodies.





SYMMETRY

What does the **prototype and variation** tell us about **iconic** representation in language behaviour more broadly?








- (1) How do you protect the borders <u>on the one hand</u> and <u>at the same time</u> have a real earnest fair conversation about meaningful immigration reform?
- (2) <u>On one hand</u> you want to support the kid <u>but</u> when they enter into the real world, you don't get a trophy.




- (3) Donald Trump is under water <u>but on the other hand</u> he's dominating polls around the country.
- (4) We think of issues and we want a more sophisticated approach. <u>On the other hand</u>, this is the second phase of the campaign. The summer is the fun part....


